RBAW REPORT



The BYC is a supporting member of the Recreational Boating Association of Washington [as every individual member should be as well...Ed] and member BJ Ursin represents us at its meetings, and files the following report...

DSC/VHF RADIO: If you have installed a DSC/VHF radio and obtained an FCC ship radio license in the last few years, an MMSI number has already been assigned to your vessel. If you do not plan to cruise international waters (Canada) and do not have an MMSI number, you may contact BoatUS to obtain your MMSI number free; or try: <http://www.boatus.com/mmsi/>. MMSI numbers assigned by BoatUS, including your vessel description and emergency contact information, are stored in the USCG Search and Rescue database, but are not shared with the International Search and Rescue database.

If you plan to cruise into international waters, i.e. Canada, you must have an FCC ship radio license and an FCC-assigned MMSI number. One easy method to accomplish this is to phone 1-888-225-5322 and select option #2. An FCC representative will guide you through the process. Connect the GPS to the NMEA port and program the MMSI number into the radio

To transmit a MAYDAY or distress call, press the red button on the DSC/VHF radio for five seconds and a digital signal will automatically be transmitted with your vessel's name, your ID, and your latitude & longitude position. This signal will be repeated until received by the USCG or other boats within range. When your emergency signal is received, your VHF radio will automatically switch from channel 70 to channel 16 where rescuers can contact you and start voice-to-voice communication.

With most DSC/VHF radios you may also hail a friend (or group of friends). To accomplish this, enter your friend's MMSI number into your DSC VHF radio's memory (similar to a cell phone memory) along with the working channel you wish to use, i.e., channel 78. Select your friend's MMSI number and call. His/her DSC radio will "ring" on channel 70 and will display your MMSI number, your vessel name, and channel 68. Switch to 68 and talk. No need to try calling via the often cluttered channel 16!

To learn all of your DSC/VHF features and procedures, the US PowerSquadron offers a self-study course called *The Boatowner's Guide to GMDSS and Marine Radio* with an inter-active CD-ROM available at 1-888-FOR-USPS. A CD with a DSC Simulator is included allowing home practice. Also, BoatUS offers a free on-line DSC/VHF tutorial *Can You Hear Me?* (www.boatus.com/mmsi/).
